# **Summary Information**

#### Overview of Licensee:

Sabah State Government, through the Sabah Forestry Department, has awarded an area of 10,018.3 hectares within the Sapulut Forest Reserve to Pesona Majukaya Sdn. Bhd. (Pesona Majukaya) under the Sustainable Forest Management License Agreement (SFMLA) No. 01/2018 for FMU 25. The SFMLA was made on 20/04/2018 and is valid for 100 years until 31/12/2117.

On 26/07/2021, the SFD issued a Coupe Permit allowing Pesona Majukaya to implement planned activities until 19/04/2068.

Pesona Majukaya is also affiliated with Top Quantum Sdn. Bhd., First Greenworld Sdn. Bhd., Zillion Fortune Sdn. Bhd., & Empayar Kejora Sdn. Bhd., which comes under the auspices of Rakan Rimba Sdn. Bhd.

Rakan Rimba Sdn. Bhd. (Rakan Rimba) prepared the CHP document and has appointed Vivadaya Sdn. Bhd., SSK Enterprise, Superkim Enterprise, Zat Istimewa Sdn. Bhd., and Datsing Sdn. Bhd. as contractors for harvesting (salvage) and planting within the licensed area and SSK Enterprise as the RIL harvesting contractor inside NFM couped area.

Pesona Majukaya has planned forestry activities within the concession area based on the following slope classifications:

Forest Plantation zone Total area = 7,769ha	Identified Areas <15° slope: (5,561ha) Clear felling allowed for plantation establishment subject to standing statutory restrictions stipulated in the license agreement. Natural trees left standing as future crop trees may be extracted in the future.  Identified Areas 15 - 25° slope: (2,213ha) Planting shall take the form of a combination of natural forest and planted forest in a mosaic pattern of more or less 60:50 ratio of planted forest to natural forest. **ITP:** Pesona Majukaya is currently focusing on salvage logging inside ITP couped areas, Compartments 1, 3, 5 to 7, 11 to 13, 16 and 17.

**NFM:** The CHP development inside the NFM compartment #: C10 and the RIL harvesting has been completed in compartment 15,

Based on the 2024 AWP, site preparation and planting were scheduled to commence in 2024. However, as of the Jun 2024 assessment, site preparation and planting have not yet commenced. The Current operations are according to FMP and AWP schedules.

Pesona Majukaya has an approved coupe permit from the SFD.

<sup>\*</sup>C15 is under NFM and not under conversion; thus, the status falls under Sabah TLAS EUDR. Harvested timber requires an EUDR stamping and geo-location on the removal pass, which is not currently implemented by the SFD.

#### **Environmental Context:**

Sapulut Forest Reserve was the most remote region of the Tawau District before a road was constructed in 1982. Sapulut Forest Reserve was gazetted as a commercial forest reserve on 18/01/1979. Prior to SFM, logging operations in Sapulut Forest Reserve were divided into working blocks of various sizes and shapes with short-term logging licenses, which comprise Special License (usually more than 5 years) and Form 1 License employing conventional harvesting method with a felling diameter of >60cm DBH.

The FMU consists of regenerating logged-over forests. In the lower-lying areas in the north, where logging was extensive and poor logging practices in the past had reduced the vegetation to a secondary forest of relatively low stature, dominated by Macaranga spp. and other tree species. However, steeper areas above 20°, in general, still support intact forests. Vine loads are high and pose a serious impediment to forest regeneration.

The project area is generally poor habitat for wildlife due to the previous logging operation creating large gaps opening from a broken canopy. Under such conditions, many arboreal animals are now scarce as they have moved away from the project area.

Based on historical records and studies conducted in FMU 25 by the Wildlife Department, several terrestrial mammal and avian species were identified; the Borneon pygmy elephants, Sambar deer, Borneon yellow muntjac, Bearded pig, Silver-leaf langur, Long-tailed macaque, Borneon gibbons, White-crowned Hornbill, Blyth hawk-eagle, etc.

The Environmental Impact Assessment was conducted and approved by Environment Protection

Department (EPD).

**Gap 005/2024 (minor) – Checklist 3.1.1:** Pesona Majukaya shall renew the Occupational Permits 3 months before the expiry date and the SFD shall expedite the approval process.

**Observation 001-2024 Checklist 1.3.2.7:** Pesona Majukaya shall revise the current FMP to include the estimated Annual Allowable Cut and the Sustainable Timber Yield Regulation for the planned NFM area.

**Observation 002-2024 Checklist 2.1.3:** Pesona Majukaya shall correctly identify species following harvesting to avoid discrepancy between harvest records & CHP tree harvest list.

Observation 003-2024 Checklist 2.2.3: The SFD shall implement the stamping of Sabah TLAS EUDR and geo-location on the removal passes. **Observation 004-2024 Checklist 2.3.3:** Pesona Majukaya should establish PSPs in NFM areas to
