# **Summary Information**

### **Overview of Licensee**

### **Organization Information:**

The license holder, Ta Ann Plywood Sdn. Bhd. (208737-T) (Ta Ann Plywood) is a 100% subsidiary of Ta Ann Holdings Berhad, a public company listed on the Main Board of the Bursa Malaysia (Kuala Lumpur Stock Exchange) on 23<sup>rd</sup> November 2009.

Ta Ann Holdings Berhad is a timber resource-based company based in Sibu, Sarawak, Malaysia. It was founded in the mid-1980's as a trading company by Datuk Abdul Hamed Bin Haji Sepawi, Datuk Wahab Bin Haji Dolah and Dato Wong Kuo Hea, starting as a forest concession licensee, including timber harvesting, and downstream industries (veneer, plywood, coated plywood, eco-plywood, laminated veneer lumber and pachinko plywood, sawn timber and laminated moulding). Ta Ann Holdings Berhad was incorporated as a public limited company in February 1997 and listed on the Bursa Malaysia in November 1999.

Ta Ann Holdings Berhad has embarked on research and development (R&D) to produce improved tree planting material of *Acacia mangium*, *Superbulk and Acacia hybrid*, for higher quality and yield for veneer production. Ta Ann Holdings Berhad plans to gradually shift to plantation-based timber using local species such as Kelampayan (*Neolamarckia cadamba*) planted in terraces (and alongside of skid trails).

Ta Ann Plywood engaged Hariwood Sdn. Bhd. as their contractor to conduct forest plantation activities, including planting, felling, extracting, and transporting of logs.

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### **Description & License:**

The Licence for Planted Forest No. LPF/0010 area is located south of Song town, in the Song District of the Kapit Division in the state of Sarawak, Malaysia. The total concession area is 69,316 hectares (ha) and divided into four management divisions, Rejang, Woodley, Pasin and Naman. The license was issued on 8<sup>th</sup> December 1998 for 60 years, expiring on 7<sup>th</sup> December 2058. Rejang, Woodley, and Pasin Divisions are planned for tree plantations, while Naman Division is planted in oil palm. Naman Division is fully planted in oil palm and evaluated under the MSPO. The scope of this assessment includes Rejang, Woodley, and Pasin Divisions.

#### Management / Land Tenure:

The State of Sarawak issued the License of Planted Forests (LPF/0010) license to Ta Ann Plywood Sdn. Bhd. for a period of 60 years commencing from 08 December 1998 and ending on 07 December 2058. Ta Ann Plywood shall have the right to establish, develop and maintain on the said land/planted forest in accordance with a tree planting plan approved by the Director of Forests.

### Management Planning (FMP / GP):

License for Planted Forest No. LPF/0010 is under a Tree Planting Plan with the license issued by the Director of the Forest Department Sarawak (30 August 2017) valid until 07 December 2058. Based on the last review of the license, the Tree Planting Plan was revised and approved by FDS on 30 August 2017 (Ref.#: WPO/P/106 (XII)-79).

#### **Environmental context:**

Forest type and history of management

Principal commercial species

The current vegetation in Rejang, Woodley, and Pasin divisions are predominantly logged-over remnant hill Mixed Dipterocarp Forest (MDF), with small margins of virgin forest in Pasin Division along the Sarawak / Indonesia border. The remnant vegetation varies in structure and species composition depending on terrain conditions and the intensity of previous timber harvesting. Also, in the Pasin Division, there are large areas of shifting agriculture in the northern part and isolated kerangas in the south.

Specific biological values (e.g. rare or endangered species)

The EIA identified several protected mammals, including the orang utan, generally located adjacent to the Lanjak Entimau Wildlife Sanctuary and the Indonesian border. Other protected mammals are the Bornean gibbon, Hose's langur, maroon langur, clouded leopard, western tarsier, slow loris and giant squirrel. Protected avian species are six species of hornbills, Argus pheasant and Bulwer's pheasant.

- Environmental services (e.g. critical watersheds, wildlife corridor, etc.) provided by the forest The Woodley Division is drained by Sg. Lajan Besat to the north, Sg. Sebatu to the west and Sg. Lanang to the south. The east of Woodley Division drains into Sg. Mukoh and Sg. Tekalit and eventually to Sg. Katibas. Streams in the east of Rejang Division drain into Sg. Matalau. In the western region, streams flowing northwards drain into Sg. Matalau while those flowing southwards drain into Sg. Laup and Sg. Nging.
  - Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA)

EIA titled "Environmental Impact Assessment for Tree Planting under Licence for Planted Forests No. LPF/0010 in the Sibu and Kapit Divisions, Sarawak" was conducted by registered environmental consultant firm, Plantacia Sdn. Bhd. and approved by the Natural Resources and Environment Board (NREB) on 10 December 1999 (Ref.#: (8) NREB/6-11/64).

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### Social context

#### Social Assessment:

In June 2012, Ta Ann Plywood engaged Ecosol Consultancy Sdn. Bhd. to conduct a separate Social Impact Assessment (SIA), covering the Tree Plantation Areas in Woodley, Pasin and Rejang Divisions, including an evaluation of settlements. As the result, there were 63 villages located within a 3 km radius, and 14 villages outside of the 3 km radius claiming their shifting cultivation areas within LPF No. LPF/0010. However, only 27 villages were visited and surveyed.

### **Key findings of social assessment:**

Identified communities dependent on the FTL / LPF.

Since the LPF No. LPF/0010 was revised on 29<sup>th</sup> May 2017 to cover an area of 69,316 ha, all the longhouses are no longer located within the licensed area.

All longhouses listed in this report were based on Rejang & Woodley divisions as there were no operations within the Pasin Division. The information recorded in this report is based on documentation and information provided by the Ta Ann Plywood for Rejang & Woodley divisions. Community areas claimed in Rejang Division are identified in Map A and for Woodley Division in Map B.

#### Maps of longhouse communities.

Areas claimed by local communities for Woodley and Rejang divisions are mapped and updated as of October 2022 (for Woodley) and October 2023 (for Rejang). Areas claimed for Pasin division are not available, as Ta Ann Plywood does not have operations in this area in 2022 and 2023.

### Native Customary Rights – Agreements

Ta Ann Plywood has a system to establish formal agreements with each longhouse community for compensation for resource use within areas claimed. Agreements are reached through negotiations and discussions as operations progress, i.e., on a coupe-by-coupe basis. Once an agreement has been reached, provisions are laid out in a documented agreement that is read and interpreted to all parties to declare that they have fully understood and agreed to the terms prior to signing. Current payments are based on the volume of extracted timber within the claimed areas after local communities have finalized and resolved any conflicting land claims.

### **Social Monitoring:**

Regular communication and consultation between Ta Ann Plywood and local communities have been demonstrated since the commencement of logging operations. Community claims or issues are recorded, monitored and dealt following the company's Standard Operation Procedures (SOP). Ta Ann Plywood compensates the local communities for damages or losses to areas claimed through signed agreements. Audit interviews with local community identified that, in general, the communities are happy with their relationship with Ta Ann Plywood.

### **Scope of Assessment**

- The scope of the evaluation is to verify compliance with LPF No. LPF/0010, Ta Ann Plywood Sdn. Bhd. with the Principles 1-4 of the STLVS Standard (v03) 01 April 2021.
- Site evaluation to verify and report the level of compliance by **Ta Ann Plywood Sdn. Bhd. and Hariwood Sdn. Bhd.** to the standard in respect to each of the criteria within this report.
- Compliance is defined when the auditee demonstrates that the indicators consist of only minor gaps or no gaps against any applicable criteria of the standard. Non-compliance to the Sarawak Legality Standard occurs when a Major Gap is issued against an indicator and associated criterion.

### **Highlights of Assessment**

**Ta Ann Plywood Sdn**. **Bhd**. has complied with the Sarawak Legality Standard (Principles 1-4) as *no* noncompliance was identified during the assessment on 11 – 15 December 2023.

Summary of current status of operations against each principle.

### Principle 1:

Ta Ann Plywood has demonstrated compliance with license requirements and management planning guidelines. Currently, salvage logging is carried out at Coupe 14E (Rejang Division) with a valid PEC.

### Principle 2:

Ta Ann Plywood has demonstrated compliance with forestry operation standards.

Boundaries and areas designated for protection, such as buffer zones, were marked with signs and paint as depicted on the maps.

Ta Ann Plywood has a formal schedule for monitoring and patrolling inside the licensed area. Based on their patrolling records, two illegal activities were identified in April and May 2023 and were reported to the relevant authorities.

As of the assessment, no harvesting of planted trees within LPF areas from November 2022 to December 2023.

LPI tags and DPR are only required for the extraction of logs from the salvage logging but not for planted timber. Ta Ann Plywood adequately maintained both salvage logging and plantation harvesting related documents on production, royalties and transportation.

Field workers had valid documents and were covered by SOCSO and were equipped with PPE. Ta Ann Plywood provided adequate training to workers. Training records were documented and maintained.

### December 2023: Observation 001-2023 - Checklist 2.1.4

The GPS readings for encroachment area were not consistently recorded in the patrolling report.

Ta Ann Plywood demonstrated compliance with the statutory charges, such as royalty & fees and maintained records.

### Principle 4:

In June 2012, Ta Ann Plywood engaged Ecosol Consultancy Sdn. Bhd. to conduct a Social Impact Assessment (SIA) covering the Tree Plantation Areas in Woodley, Pasin and Rejang Divisions, which included an evaluation of settlements. There were 63 villages located within a 3 km radius, as well as 14 villages outside of the 3 km radius claiming shifting cultivation areas within LPF No. LPF/0010.

Since the LPF No. LPF/0010 was revised on 29<sup>th</sup> May 2017 to cover an area of 69,316 ha; all the longhouses were no longer located within the licensed area. However, some longhouses still have claims over lands within the recently revised LPF No. LPF/0010 concession. Ta Ann Plywood maintained the mutual agreement between the longhouses before conducting any harvesting operations within areas claimed by community.
