Summary Information

Overview of Licensee:

The Sabah Foundation (Yayasan Sabah) is a statutory government entity formed by enactment in the Sabah State Legislative Assembly in 996. Its' general objectives are to provide educational opportunities, social welfare support, as well as equitable economic opportunities for the people of Sabah. In order to fulfil these objectives, the Foundation was allocated a large forest concession area in Sabah, comprising 8 FMU which cover a total area of close to 800,000 hectares. This entire concession area is licensed for 100 years to the Foundation under Sustainable Forest Management Licensed Agreement 09/97 (SFMLA). By an agreement in 1971, the Sabah Foundation assigned the rights to manage and conduct all commercial forestry operations related to this concession to Rakyat Berjaya. As such, Rakyat Berjaya serves as the commercial arm of the Foundation.

In October 2010, the Forestry Department approved the FMP for FMU 15 and 16, covering approximately 176, 993 ha of the Sg. Pinangah Forest Reserve. The Sg. Pinangah Forest reserve is designed by law as a Commercial Forest Reservce (Class II) intended primarily for timber production.

In the FMP for FMUs 15 and 16, an area of about 20,151 hectares within FMU 16 is allocated for intensive forest rehabilitation, following a mosaic planting approach that integrates natural forest management and forest plantations. This decision was made due to poor timber stands in the area. For the purpose of this proposed development, a sub-FMP is required. The proposed 20,151 ha area (Project Area) was previously logged between 2003 and 2011.

The sub-FMP was submitted by Rakyat Berjaya to the SFD in reference to the project area, based on the approved FMP for FMUs 15 & 16. The plan outlines the development and implementation plan for the project are over a period of 10 years. The primary long-term goal is to ensure the sustainable production of timber from both the systematic cultivation of fast-growing trees and the improvement of existing natural timber stands, in compliance with all existing rules, regulations and prescribed constraints.

Beta Bumi Sdn. Bhd. a Sandakan-based company, with a long-term interest in the timber industry, has been appointed by Rakyat Berjaya as the contractor to undertake the task of developing the project area.

The Integrated Mosaic Planting Agreement was made on 18/03/2013 between Rakyat Berjaya (the Licensee) and Beta Bumi (the Contractor), whereas the Contractor is managing and securing wood resources on a long-term basis for the purposes of sustainable production of timber and natural industrial products. The agreement shall be deemed to have come into force on 07/12/2012 and shall, unless previously terminated under Clause 43 or 68, terminate or expiry date of a period of 50 years.

Beta Bumi manages 19,421 ha under FMU 16 that is divided into areas 'A', 'B' and 'C' located in the centre of Sabah and clustered around the Imbak Canyon Conservation Area. Areas A, B, C have 7 approved Coupe Permits with 50-year validity.

Current Operations:

The last logging activities were conducted in December 2022 (Area B).

Due to poor planting performance, the SFD has mandated that Beta Bumi completes planting of backlog area of 4,501 hectares (Ref. #: JPHTN/SFM 800-1/1/7/7/99, dated 23/05/2023).

The approved AWP 2025, states that Beta Bumi is strictly not allowed to conduct salvage logging until the planting target of 1,500 hectares in the AWP 2025 is completed including conditions listed under Ref. #: JPHTN/SFM800-1/1/7/7/(JILID.2)/91 dated 18/12/2024).

Based on the AWP 2025, the plan for mosaic planting is designated for Compartments B1 to B10.

Note* Based on the Land Use map of the concession area provided by Beta Bumi, geo-location is based on Area B, not individual compartments.

Environmental Context:

Area 'B' is relatively flat, whereas the terrain in Area 'A' and 'C' is more undulating topography. The highest point is 620 m located in Area 'C' and 80% of all licensed area falls below 300 m asl. Site relief of the 3 licensed areas is given in the table below:

The major rivers draining the area are Sg. Pinangah, Sg. Milan, Sg. Imbak, Sg. Sinoa.

The main soil type is Orthic acrisols and deemed marginal for agriculture development.

Mean annual rainfall is 3,063 mm, with the driest months in March, April and October, while December and January are the wettest months.

The 3 licensed areas once supported rich lowland mixed dipterocarp forests and are now relegated to a residual forest that is considered poor due to bad logging practices in the past.

The forest area harbours some iconic species, such as the Orangutans, Borneo gibbons, Tembadau and Borneo pygmy elephants but in low numbers. Poor logging practices have exacerbated the already low wildlife density by forest fragmentation (broken canopy, large gaps, open conditions, etc.). Wildlife habitat is expected to improve as the forest recovers over time.

The mosaic planting area shares a common boundary with Buffer Zone 1 of the Maliau Basin Conservation Area and is also located in Buffer Zone 2 of the Maliau Basin Conservation Area.

Social Context:

SIA was conducted in 2018 by a SocioEco Research & Consultancy Sdn. Bhd. There are no human settlements within the project area. However, there are several villages located within a distance of about 10 KM from the project area boundary. 4 groups of village communities involving a total of 10 villages around the project area have been involved in the SIA study based on whether the village is close to the project area or is likely to face impacts due to Maxland's logging activity.

Scope of Assessment

- The scope of the evaluation is to verify compliance of Rakyat Berjaya Sdn. Bhd. (Beta Bumi Sdn. Bhd.) with the Sabah Forest Management License Agreement (SFMLA 09/97) for FMU 16.
- The assessment is in accordance with the terms of the agreement for the "Sabah Legality Standard Principles 1 4 dated 1 January 2024 (SFD-TLAS-006).
- Site evaluation to verify and report the level of compliance by Rakyat Berjaya Sdn. Bhd. (Beta Bumi Sdn. Bhd.) and contractors to the standard in respect to each of the criteria within this report.
- Compliance is defined when the auditee demonstrates that the indicators consist of none or only minor gaps against any applicable criteria of the standard. Non-compliance to the Sabah Legality Standard occurs when the auditee does not comply adequately with a criterion.

Rakyat Berjaya Sdn. Bhd. (Beta Bumi Sdn. Bhd.) has complied with the Sabah TLAS requirements (FDS TLAS-006) as no non-compliance was identified during the assessment on 10-14 February 2025.

Summary of status of operations by **Principle**:

Principle 1. Right to Harvest

Beta Bumi has obtained approval for its Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) and Annual Work Plan. Beta Bumi submitted a formal request to the SFD to extend the submission deadline for the final Forest Management Plan (FMP) draft to March 31, 2025 (Ref. #.: BB/AD/06/10/2024/NS). Subsequently, Beta Bumi held a meeting with the SFD in October 2024, during which the SFD approved the extension for improving the FMP, setting the new deadline for March 2025.

Principle 2. Forest Operations

The most recent logging operation was carried out in December 2022. Protected areas, including buffer zones, have been clearly delineated and excluded from forestry operations. During the assessment, no evidence of encroachment within these protected areas was identified. Additionally, no illegal activities were observed or reported to the relevant authorities.

Gap 003/2025 (minor) – Checklist 1.5.2, 1.6.4, 1.6.5, 1.6.6, 1.7.2: Beta Bumi shall develop CHPP/CPP for planned planting in Mosaic compartments that clearly define map areas for planting and should be included in the AWP.

Gap 004/2025 (minor) – Checklist 1.5.3: Beta Bumi shall demonstrate implementation of the activities listed in AWP 2024 onwards.

Gap 005/2025 (minor) – Checklist 2.3.3: Establish PSPs in planting and natural forest areas and annually measure them to provide credible monitoring of resources and growth.

Observation 002-2025 – Checklist 1.3.2.13: Beta Bumi should ensure the FFMP submitted on time for the SFD to review and approve the FFMP.

The next annual surveillance audit will be scheduled for February 2026.
