Summary Information

Overview of Licensee:

- The Tree Plantation and Forestry Management Agreement dated 24/04/1996 and a Tree Plantation and Forestry Management (Supplemental) agreement, JP (TKA) 122/96(CO) dated 15/02/1999 was made between Benta Wawasan Sdn. Bhd. (Benta Wawasan) and the State of Sabah to manage a forests area of approximately 106,310 hectares situated at Gunung Rara and Kalabakan Forest Reserve.
- Benta Wawasan is a wholly owned subsidiary of Innoprise Corporation Sdn. Bhd. (Innoprise Corporation). Innoprise Corporation is a wholly owned subsidiary of Yayasan Sabah.
- In 2004, a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) was signed between Benta Wawasan and Yayasan Melaka. Through this MOU, both Benta Wawasan and Yayasan Melaka agreed to jointly develop an area within the Yayasan Sabah Group Management Unit into a large-scale oil palm plantation, hereinafter referred to as Samel Plantation Sdn. Bhd. (Samel Plantation).
- The Sabah Forestry Department (SFD) approved the area for conversion into an oil palm plantation in 2005.
- Benta Wawasan joint ventured with Samel Plantation that is responsible for developing 5,343.81 ha of the area (Samel I and Samel II) under the Agro-forestry project.
- On 12/12/2019, the forest operations were temporarily handed over to Benta Wawasan Sdn. Bhd. until the final decision from Samel Plantation's Board of Directors.
- On 01/07/2021, Adaza Plantation Management Sdn. Bhd. (Adaza Plantation Management) was appointed through a separate contractual agreement as a contractor to conduct oil palm plantation development for Samel Plantation.

Initially, on 30/08/2022, Benta Wawasan has appointed Premium Select Resources as a subcontractor for recovering and collecting hardwood logs (e.g. belian, merbau, etc.) inside Samel II Division. The contract has been extended until 24/04/2024 [Ref.#: BWSB (PSM): 600-5/4 24/06 dated 25/01/2024].
- The application for a Form IIB permit was in phases.

Benta Wawasan joint ventured with Samel Plantation that is responsible for developing approximately 5,000 ha of the area (Samel I and Samel II) under the agro-forestry project. On 01/07/2021, Adaza Plantation Management Sdn. Bhd. was appointed through a separate contractual agreement as a contractor to conduct oil palm plantation development for Samel Plantation.

Dates

The major gaps **003/2022**, **004/2023** and **001/2024** was not addressed by May 2024. Samel Plantation could not provide documents such as the COI and SOCSO contributions for workers. There is no evidence of Azada Plantation Management's OP renewal. They did not register heavy machinery and have not rectified the ECR issues raised in 2023.

Recommendations

Benta Wawasan Sdn. Bhd. (Samel Plantation Sdn. Bhd.) has not complied with the Sabah Legality Standard (SFD-TLAS-002) as non-compliance were identified under Criteria 1.2, 2.1, 2.2, 2.3 & 3.1 and is NOT eligible to receive a GFS Statement of Compliance or Sabah Timber Legality Assurance System Compliance Certificate (TLAS-CC) from SFD.

The major gap(s) shall be addressed within two months by **May 2024.**

Gap 003/2022 (Raised to Major) Outstanding – Checklist 2.3.1, 2.3.5: Samel Plantation shall require their subcontractor to register all workers under SOCSO and have valid COI, passport & work permits. Gap 001/2024 (Raised to Major) Outstanding – Checklist 1.2.3, 2.1.11: Adaza Plantation Management shall rectify issues raised inside the ECR report.

Gap 004/2023 (Raised to Major) Outstanding – Checklist 2.2.2, 3.1.1: Adaza Plantation Management shall renew all OP and FD annually.

Gap(s)/Observation(s) identified in this assessment should be addressed before the next surveillance visit. Action required to close the gap(s)/observation(s) include:

Gap 001/2023 (minor) Outstanding - Checklist 1.3.3, 1.6.1: Samel Plantation shall revise the management plan to include planned activities annually and revise the land use table.

Gap 002/2023 (minor) Outstanding - Checklist 1.4.1, 2.1.8: Samel Plantation shall nclude any additional planned activities in the AWP annually (e.g., logs recovery, etc.)

Gap 003/2023 (minor) Outstanding - Checklist 2.3.7: Samel Plantation shall develop and submit the Forest Fire Management Plan (FFMP) to SFD.

Gap 002/2024 (minor) – Checklist 1.7.3, 2.1.13: Adaza Plantation Management shall display signboards at the riparian and buffer zone area.

Gap 003/2024 (minor) – Checklist 2.1.18: Adaza Plantation Management shall conduct record the forest security patrolling.

Gap 004/2024 (Raised to minor) – Checklist 3.1.2: Adaza Plantation Management shall maintain the FFB royalty payment as appropriate.

The next annual surveillance audit will be scheduled for March 2025.
