OBJECTIVES:

- The objective of this checklist is to verify compliance to the Criteria listed in the Sabah Legality Standard as defined by Principles 1 4 for Sabah dated November 2020 (SFD-TLAS-002).
- Compliance is defined when all applicable criteria are observed to be compliant. A Minor Gap to any
 indicator does not constitute non-compliance to a criterion. A Major Gap to any applicable indicator
 does reflect non-compliance to a criterion. Compliance for a criterion where multiple minor gaps are
 identified in indicators under the criterion may reflect non-compliance to the criterion.
- All issues identified under this standard shall be considered appropriate to the scale and degree of forestry operations undertaken by the parties under the agreement.

Summary Information

Overview of Licensee:

- Rakyat Berjaya Sdn. Bhd. (Rakyat Berjaya) was appointed in 1970 to manage FMU 23, in which the licensed area is located, along with the 7 other Forest Management Units (FMUs), which make up the Yayasan Sabah Concession Area.
- The Yayasan Sabah Concession Area (8 FMUs) is under the jurisdiction of the Kalabakan District Forestry Office of the Sabah Forestry Department.
- Rakyat Berjaya obtained a license to manage FMU 23, where operations focus mainly on harvesting (Natural Forest Management), planting (harvesting / clearing of degraded forests followed by planting Mosaic ITP areas) and oil palm (Agroforestry).
- Land tenure is based on the following:
 - The Sustainable Forest Management Licensed Agreement (SFMLA) 09/1997 commenced on 10 September 1997 with a 100-year tenure which will expire on 10 September 2097.
 - A supplementary agreement to reduce the Yayasan Sabah Concession Area from 799,828 ha to 599,828 ha was signed on 15 February 1999.
 - Tree Plantation and Forest Management Agreement JP (TKA) 122/96(Co) 24 April 1996 106,310 ha and Supplemental Agreement JP (TKA) 122/96(Co) 200,000 ha 15 February 1999 for NFM and tree planting under Benta Wawasan Sdn. Bhd.
- Empayar Kejora Sdn. Bhd. (Empayar Kejora) is the appointed contractor to carry out residual timber extraction and develop a mosaic-planting scheme within the licensed area in FMU 23 located within the Gunung Rara Forest Reserve (Ref.#: FD/KK/4.4/16/1 dated 06 December 2011).
- Empayar Kejora is affiliated with Zillion Fortune Sdn. Bhd., Rakan Rimba Sdn. Bhd., First Greenworld Sdn. Bhd., Pesona Majukaya Sdn. Bhd. and Top Quantum Sdn. Bhd.
- The integrated mosaic tree planting system is implemented to ensure sustainable timber production by planting fast-growing indigenous and exotic species for the production of highvolume timber.
- The previous assessment was conducted in June 2022 that resulted in 1 gap(s) and 3 observation(s) (Report #: GFSSBH003-132).

Current Operations:

- As of the assessment, no log production has occurred since 2020.
- Empayar Kejora is focusing on maintenance of tree plantations and forest protection.

Note: A discrepancy of 731.6 ha in the total licensed area was identified between the 2nd FMP (2022-2032) and 1st FMP (2012 - 2022) due to the remeasurement of the licensed area during the preparation of the 2nd FMP.

Environmental Context:

- Rakyat Berjaya has an approved EIA for NFM, ITP and OPP (oil palm plantation) operations within the management areas of FMU 23. The main species planted are Laran (*Neolamarckia cadamba*), Binuang (*Octomeles sumatrana*), Talisai (*Terminalia spp.*), Batai (*Falcataria moluccana*), Diterocarp spp., and oil palm under the ITP Coupe permit for Agro-forestry.
- Wildlife sighted (based on accidental sightings and camera traps) within the FMU area includes the Borneon pygmy elephants, Orangutans, Proboscis monkeys, Sun bear, Clouded leopard, Tembadau, Bulwar pheasant, Great argus pheasant, Sambar deer, Borneon yellow muntjac, and bearded pig.
- Strips of riparian reserves, which serves as wildlife corridors to Maliau Basin and Danum Valley conservation areas, are being maintained.
- Rakyat Berjaya has an approved EIA study for the forestry operations inside Empayar Kejora licensed area.

 No local communities are found within a 10 KM radius of the project area. The nearest villages are Kg. Pekan Kalabakan-Mangga, Kg. Rancangan Kalabakan, Kg. Tuda, Kg. Murutulu Kalabakan and Kg. Brantian, located in the vicinity of the Kalabakan Forest District.

Scope of Assessment

- The scope of the evaluation is to verify compliance of **Rakyat Berjaya Sdn. Bhd. (Empayar Kejora Sdn. Bhd.)** with the Sustainable Forest Management License Agreement (SFMLA 09/97) for FMU 23 (partly).
- The assessment is in accordance on the terms of the agreement for the "Sabah Legality Standard Principles 1 4 dated November 2020 (SFD-TLAS-002).
- Site evaluation to verify and report the level of compliance by **Rakyat Berjaya Sdn. Bhd.** and Empayar Kejora to the standard in respect to each of the criteria within this report.
- Compliance is defined when the auditee demonstrates that the indicators consist of none or only minor gaps against any applicable criteria of the standard. Non-compliance to the Sabah Legality Standard occurs when the auditee does not demonstrate adequate compliance to a criterion.

Rakyat Berjaya Sdn. Bhd. (Empayar Kejora Sdn. Bhd.) has complied with the Sabah Legality Standard (SFD-TLAS-002) as no non-compliance was identified during the assessment on 05 – 09 June 2023.

Summary of status of operations by **Principle**:

Principle 1.

FMU 23 is licensed to Rakyat Berjaya under SFMLA 09/97 dated 10 September 1997 and expires on 09 September 2097. Rakyat Berjaya and Empayar Kejora have an Integrated Mosaic Planting Agreement dated 16 July 2012.

Principle 2.

Empayar Kejora has demonstrated compliance with the Environmental Impact Assessment requirements. The demarcation of riparian reserves and buffer zones was identified and observed without disturbance. Empayar Kejora had the approval to harvest the Batai affected with Gall Rust Fungus infection [Ref.#: JPHTN/KKH 700-2/1/56/JILID.2/(23) dated 21/08/2019]. However, the logging was halted in 2020 due to poor market value. As of the assessment, there has been no log production since 2020.
