OBJECTIVES:

- The objective of this checklist is to verify compliance to the Criteria listed in the Sabah Legality Standard as defined by Principles 1 4 for Sabah dated November 2020 (SFD-TLAS-002).
- Compliance is defined when all applicable criteria are observed to be compliant. A Minor Gap to any indicator does not constitute non-compliance to a criterion. A Major Gap to any applicable indicator does reflect non-compliance to a criterion. Compliance for a criterion where multiple minor gaps are identified in indicators under the criterion may reflect non-compliance to the criterion.
- All issues identified under this standard shall be considered appropriate to the scale and degree of forestry operations undertaken by the parties under the agreement.

Summary Information

Overview of Licensee:

- Maxland Sdn. Bhd. (Maxland) is appointed by the Rakyat Berjaya Sdn. Bhd. (Rakyat Berjaya) under the subsidiary of the Sabah Foundation (Yayasan Sabah), which holds a Sustainable Forest Management License Agreement (SFMLA 09/97) that includes FMU 16.
- The entire concession area has been licensed for 100 years.
- Rakyat Berjaya logged FMU 16 between 1994 and 1998, then again between 2008 and 2009, under Block YS2/07 (1) & (2) Coupe SDK 02/11 with a total area of 4,900 ha.
- An agreement was signed between Rakyat Berjaya and Maxland on 18/03/2013 to carry out Integrated Mosaic Planting, which also covers the development of tree plantations and royalty and fees, penalties and other contractual provisions.
- The previous assessment was conducted in April 2022 that resulted in 2 gap(s) and 1 observation(s) (Report #: GFSSBH003-124a).

Current Operations:

As of the assessment, there are no harvesting activities in the ITP areas.

The project area is divided into 21 ITP compartments.

Environmental Context:

- The project area is classified as Class II Commercial Forest Reserve. Due to poor logging practices, the vegetation was reduced to a secondary forest of low stature, dominated by *Macaranga* spp., and impoverished commercial timber trees and regeneration.
- Common dipterocarps still found in the residual forests include *Dryobalanops beccarii, Shorea smithiana, S. macroptera, S. mecystopteryx* and *Parashorea malanonaan.*
- The project area is generally poor in wildlife resulting from poor logging practices with a residual forest characterized by a very broken canopy, large gaps, and open conditions. Under such conditions, many arboreal animals are now scarce. Elephants are known to forage in the project area occasionally.
- There are many small streams within the project area, most of them unnamed. All the streams generally flow into two (2) major rivers, Sg. Milian and Sg. Pinangah.

• The Environmental Impact Assessment was conducted and approved by Environment Protection Department (EPD).

Rakyat Berjaya Sdn. Bhd. (Maxland Sdn. Bhd.) has not complied with the Sabah Legality Standard **(SFD-TLAS-002)** as non-compliance was identified under criteria 1.3 and 1.6 during the assessment on 27 – 31 March 2023.

Summary of status of operations by Principle:

Principle 1.

Sabah Foundation (Yayasan Sabah) holds a Sustainable Forest Management License Agreement (SFMLA 09/97) that includes FMU 16, which expires on 10/09/2097. An agreement was signed between Rakyat Berjaya and Maxland on 18/03/2013 to carry out Integrated Mosaic Planting, which also covers the development of tree plantations and royalty and fees, penalties and other contractual provisions.

April 2022: Gap 001/2022 (Major) - Checklist 1.3.1, 1.3.3 & 1.6.1

The 10-year Plantation Development Plan expired in 2020 with no evidence that a new PDP has been developed and submitted for approval.

Maxland has yet to submit the 2nd Plantation Development Plan draft to SFD.

May 2023: Gap 001/2022 (Major) - Outstanding

Maxland has yet to submit the 2nd Plantation Development Plan draft to SFD.

Rakyat Berjaya Sdn. Bhd. (Maxland Sdn. Bhd.) has not demonstrated compliance with the Sabah Legality Standard (SFD-TLAS-002) as non-compliance was identified under Criteria 1.3 & 1.6 and is NOT recommended to receive a GFS Statement of Compliance or a Sabah TLAS Compliance Certificate from SFD.

The Major Gap shall be addressed within two months by May 2023.

Gap 001/2022 (Major) Outstanding – Checklist 1.3.1, 1.3.3, 1.6.1: Maxland shall submit the 2nd Plantation Development Plan draft to SFD for approval.

Gap(s)/Observation(s) identified in this assessment should be addressed before the next surveillance visit. Action required to close the gap(s)/observation(s) include:

Gap 001/2023 (Raised to Minor) – Checklist 1.8.2: Maxland shall monitor PSP plots and analyze the data to evaluate growth in relation to estimated yields.

Observation 001-2023 - Checklist 2.3.2 & 2.3.7: Maxland shall conduct safety and fire training annually.

The next annual surveillance audit will be scheduled for March 2024.
