OBJECTIVES:

- The objective of this checklist is to verify compliance to the Criteria listed in the Sabah Legality Standard as defined by Principles 1 4 for Sabah dated November 2020 (SFD-TLAS-002).

 indicator does not constitute non-compliance to a criterion. A Major Gap to any applicable indicator
 does reflect non-compliance to a criterion. Compliance for a criterion where multiple minor gaps are

- All issues identified under this standard shall be considered appropriate to the scale and degree of forestry operations undertaken by the parties under the agreement.

Summary Information

Overview of Licensee:

- Rakyat Berjaya Sdn. Bhd. (Rakyat Berjaya) is the commercial investment arm of the Yayasan Sabah Group (YSG, also known as Sabah Foundation) which implements timber harvesting activities on behalf of the foundation.
- Rakyat Berjaya is a company registered in Malaysia. The tenure is based on the Sustainable Forest Management Licence Agreement (SFMLA 09/1997) that commenced on 10/09/1997 and expired on 10/09/2097 for all activities within the concession.
- The 100-year agreement covers all forest operations and related activities within the concession. FMU 16 comprises about 119,003 ha, containing largely logged-over natural forests of the Sg. Pinangah Forest Reserve.
- In 24/07/2012, Rakyat Berjaya and Indah Serimas Sdn. Bhd. (Indah Serimas) signed a 50-year Integrated Mosaic Planting agreement starting from 21/09/2011 in FMU 16, Block YK.01/12.
- On 16/06/2023, the State Government approved the development of a Clinker and Cement Plant by Borneo Cement (Sabah) Sdn. Bhd. inside FMU 16, with 200 acres (Ref.#: Sabah State Government Gazette Notice No. 2/2023).
- As of the assessment, Indah Serimas is not engaging any other subcontractor in logging or planting activities inside the project area.
- The previous assessment was conducted in February 2023 that resulted in 1 gap(s) and 2 observation(s) (Report #: GFSSBH003-181).

Current Operations:

- Mosaic Area: Indah Serimas is currently conducting salvage logging in Compartments 735, 736 and 739 under block YK.01/12(1).
- As of the assessment, 3,421 logs and 6,062.93 m³ have been harvested.

- The current planting area is in Compartments 727, 728, 735, 736 and 739 under block YK.01/12(1). The planting target area for 2024 is 445.53 ha.
- As of the assessment, a cumulative total planted area of 2,719.79 ha was planted with 937,727 seedlings.

Environmental Context:

- FMU 16 has been logged several times for the past 30 years. Harvesting started in the early 70's
 and continued in the 80's and 90's with the issuance of eight Special Licenses. Since Rakyat
 Berjaya received the SFMLA, the area has been proactively logged using conventional
 techniques. These historically poor logging practices have resulted in a residual forest considered
 poor in commercial regeneration, with extensive pioneer tree cover and rapidly proliferating vine
 growth.
- Rakyat Berjaya carried out a combined forest inventory for FMU 15 and 16 for the 2011-2020 FMP in 2009. The inventory defined broad species groups such as Dipterocarps, commercial non-Dipterocarps, pioneers, and "other" non-commercial trees but did not identify individual species of commercial value. The inventory identified 9.08 % Stratum 1, 3.5% Stratum 2, 12.88% Stratum 3, 74.04% Stratum 4 and 0.36% Stratum 5 within the total 119,003 ha of FMU 16. Within the mosaic restoration project area, only 28% of inventory plots were stocked with PCTs; of those, almost 50% have diameters below 20 cm DBH. Eighteen percent of the plots were devoid of trees (Ref.#: 10-yr Forest Development Plan 2012-2022 for Natural Forest Management & Integrated Mosaic Planting in an area of 15,000 ha within FMU 16 Sg. Pinangah Forest Reserve).
- A small, isolated population of orangutans had been identified in FMU 16. In addition, Bornean gibbon, Pig-tailed macaque, Long-tailed macaque, Sambar deer, Bearded pig, Barking deer, Leopard cat, Common Palm civet and tree shrews were observed in FMU 15 and 16.
- Environmental resources include Sg. Inarad, Sg. Imbak and Sg. Sinua is in FMU 16, and 14
 endangered or vulnerable tree species. Also, FMU 16 is known as a "seasonal refuge" for
 Bornean pygmy elephants and contains fragmented pockets of Class IV Virgin Jungle Reserve,
 where logging activities are not permitted.
- An EIA titled "Proposed Integrated Mosaic Planting in Sungai Pinangah Forest Reserve Under Yayasan Sabah Concession Area, Tongod, Sabah" was approved by EPD (Ref.#: JPAS/PP/24/600-1/01/3/46, dated 24/07/2012).

Social Context:

- Rakyat Berjaya has a separate Social Impact Assessment (SIA) study conducted by SocioEco Research & Consultancy Sdn. Bhd. in the project area of Indah Serimas. The SIA, titled "Social Impact Assessment for the Natural Forest Management and Integrated Mosaic Planting Project within the FMU16, Sg. Pinangah Forest Reserve," was documented in February 2017.
- Based on the SIA, 4 villages were identified in close proximity to the project area, namely, Kg. Kawayoi, Kg. Tambunan Dua, Kg. Susui, and Kg. Tataliduson. The total human population was 288 mainly from the Murut ethnic group.
- The SIA stated the forest area continues to be the primary source of supply for non-timber forest products, and protein foods for the local communities.
- However, the 2nd Forest Development Plan identified 5 villages located 6 KM outside the project area, namely, Kg. Tambunan 2, Kg. Kawayoi, Kg. Susui, Kg. Tundungin, and Kg. Inarad 1. The total human population was estimated at 500 inhabitants (2nd FDP, Page 13).

Scope of Assessment

- The scope of the evaluation is to verify compliance of Rakyat Berjaya Sdn. Bhd. with the Sustainable Forest Management License Agreement (SFMLA 09/1997) for FMU 16 (partly).
- The assessment is in accordance on the terms of the agreement for the "Sabah Legality Standard Principles 1 4 dated November 2020 (SFD-TLAS-002).
- Site evaluation to verify and report the level of compliance by Rakyat Berjaya Sdn. Bhd. and Indah Serimas Sdn. Bhd. to the standard in respect to each of the criteria within this report.
- Compliance is defined when the auditee demonstrates that the indicators consist of none or only minor gaps against any applicable criteria of the standard. Non-compliance to the Sabah Legality Standard occurs when the auditee does not demonstrate adequate compliance to a criterion.

Rakyat Berjaya Sdn. Bhd. (Indah Serimas Sdn. Bhd.) has complied with the Sabah Legality Standard (SFD-TLAS-002) as non-compliance was addressed under Criterion 2.3 during the close-out assessment on 25-28 March 2024.

Summary of status of operations by **Principle**:

Principle 1.

Rakyat Berjaya has demonstrated compliance with the SFMLA requirement. The license agreement SFMLA 09/1997 was granted by the SFD and is valid for 100 years by 10/09/2097.

On 16/06/2023, the State Government approved the development of a Clinker and Cement Plant by Borneo Cement (Sabah) Sdn. Bhd. inside FMU 16, with a total of 200 acres (Ref.#: Sabah State Government Gazette Notice No. 2/2023). As of the assessment, the SFMLA 09/1997 amendment is not yet available.

Quarterly monitoring for the Environmental Compliance Report was conducted. As a result, there is no non-compliance identified by the EPD consultant.

Rakyat Berjaya has an approved 2nd Forest Development Plan from 01/05/2022 to 30/04/2032 (10 years) under the Sustainable Forest Management Licence Agreement 09/97 for Sg. Pinangah Forest Reserve FMU 16 (partly). The Chief Conservator of Forests approved the 2nd Forest Development Plan on 21/03/2022.

January 2024: Gap 001/2024 (minor) - Checklist 1.3.1

There is no evidence that the 10-year Forest Development Plan (2022-2032) was revised as required by the SFD.

January 2022: Observation 001-2022 – Checklist 1.3.2.4

Observed the total area allocated for Mosaic in Forest Development Plan is greater than the approved coupe area.

February 2023: Observation 001-2022 (Outstanding)

Rakyat Berjaya has yet to address the issue following to the letter submitted by Indah Serimas to Rakyat Berjaya office (Ref.#: ISSB-KK/RBJ-KK/2023(002), dated 03/02/2023).

Principle 2.

Demarcation of areas prohibited from harvesting, such as steep slopes, riparian reserves and buffer zones, were identifiable on the ground. No evidence of a disturbance was observed during the field assessment.

On 21/09/2023, during a stakeholder meeting at the Hasil Bumi office, Indah Serimas verbally acquired the temporary stumping approval inside the excised land from the Chief Conservator of Forests.

SFD approved the 6-month extension for logging operation in FMU 15, 16, 20, and 24 during the Forest Development Plan (FDP) development, subject to the Coupe permits or CHP validity [Ref.#: JPHTN/FRM 700-2/1/09/81(a)/JILID.12/51 dated 13/10/2023].

Transport documents such as Removal Pass have yet to be issued as all logs have yet to be transported out to buyer. Rakyat Berjaya has an approved Forest Fire Management Plan by SFD dated 08/09/2015.

February 2023: Gap 001/2023 (minor) - Checklist 2.1.15

Contradiction in diameter cutting limit between the 2nd FDP (page 36) and approved coupe permits.

January 2024: Gap 001/2023 (minor) - Outstanding

Bhd.) has demonstrated compliance with the Sabah Legality Standard (SFD-TLAS-002) as non-compliance was addressed under Criterion 2.3 and is NOT recommended to receive a GFS Statement of Compliance and Sabah Timber Legality Assurance System Compliance Certificate (TLAS-CC) from SFD.

Gap(s)/Observation(s) identified in this assessment should be addressed before the next surveillance visit. Action required to close the gap(s)/observation(s) include:

Gap 001/2023 (minor) Outstanding – Checklist 1.3.2.7, 2.1.15: Indah Serimas shall revise the current 2nd Forest Development Plan to reflect the diameter cutting limit as per the approved coupe permit.

Gap 001/2024 (minor) - **Checklist 1.3.1:** Indah Serimas shall revise the current 10-year 2nd Forest Development Plan (2022-2032) as required.

Gap 002/2024 (Raised to minor) – Checklist 1.3.2.4: The total coupe area for mosaic shall be in accordance with the approved coupe permit.

Gap 003/2024 (Raised to minor) - Checklist 1.8.2: The measurement of the PSP shall represent the current tree density and change in tree diameters / volume over the measurement period.

Gap 004/2024 (minor) – Checklist 2.2.2, 3.1.1: Indah Serimas shall locate the permanent stumping area and renew expired Occupational Permits as required.

Observation 001-2024 – Checklist 1.2.1: Indah Serimas shall revise the EIA study following the reduction of the project area.

Observation 002-2024 – Checklist 1.3.2.3, 4.1.1: Indah Serimas shall revise the 2nd Forest Development Plan and incorporate the information of community study based on the SIA study in 2017.

The next annual surveillance audit will be scheduled for January 2025.
