### **OBJECTIVES:**

- The objective of this checklist is to verify compliance to the Criteria listed in the Sabah Legality Standard as defined by Principles 1 4 for Sabah dated November 2020 (SFD-TLAS-002).
- Compliance is defined when all applicable criteria are observed to be compliant. A Minor Gap to any indicator does not constitute non-compliance to a criterion. A Major Gap to any applicable indicator does reflect non-compliance to a criterion. Compliance for a criterion where multiple minor gaps are identified in indicators under the criterion may reflect non-compliance to the criterion.
- All issues identified under this standard shall be considered appropriate to the scale and degree of forestry operations undertaken by the parties under the agreement.

## **Summary Information**

#### **Overview of Licensee:**

- Sapulut Forest Development Sdn. Bhd. (Sapulut Forest Development) is the signatory to the SFMLA 04/97 focusing on NFM and ITP management totalling approximately 76,613 hectares in the Sapulut Forest Reserve.
- Tenure of the SFMLA for FMU 14 starts on 10 September 1997 and is valid for 99 years, which expires on 09 September 2097 for all activities within the concession.
- Sapulut Forest Development underwent the Malaysian Criteria and Indicators for Sustainable Forest Management Certification under the PEFC-MTCS and was awarded the certification for forest management on 01/07/2021, which will expire on 10/06/2026 (Cert. #: FMC-NF 00117).
- Sapulut Forest Development engages subcontractors for forest activities, Jaya Enterprise (RIL harvesting), Evergreen Enterprise (CHP contractor), and Simgaya Enterprise (salvage logging), whereas silvicultural and planting activities are carried out by Sapulut Forest Development workers.
- The previous assessment was conducted in July 2022 that resulted in 2 gap(s) and 4 observation(s) (Report #: GFSSBH003-138).

#### **Environmental Context:**

- In 2000, the Government of Sabah issued approximately 26 timber licenses to third-party contractors to carry out harvesting activities over approximately 26,481 ha. Harvesting activities were completed by the year 2005. Sapulut Forest Development has currently managed the forest concession for NFM, restoration and planting of fast-growing species.
- Despite the historical logging of the FMU, wildlife activities are abundant in the area. Wildlife studies have documented more than 40 species of mammals and not less than 150 species of birds were recorded in the area, which accounts for approximately 23% and 33% of the total number of mammals and birds recorded in Borneo, respectively.
- Sapulut Forest Development has an approved Special Environmental Impact Assessment for their licensed area (Title: Forest Logging & Plantation of 95,300ha FMU14 Sapulut, Sabah) [Ref. #: JKAS/PP/12/600-1/01/3/10(88) dated 16 June 2005].

#### **Social Context:**

- Based on the FMP, there is no community settlement within the licensed area. Local settlements are located within the bordering state land, consisting of 9 villages with approximately 1,500 people.
- The surrounding villages are Kg. Sapulut, Kg. Labang, Kg. Bigor, Kg. Tonomon, Kg. Simatuoh, Kg. Liningkar, Kg. Samuran, Kg. Tataluan and Kg. Salung. The local communities are mainly from the Murut Tagol ethnic group. The communities are sedentary agriculturists who do not have to use the resources in the SFMLA area because State land forest resources are sufficient to meet the local needs.
- Sapulut Forest Development recently developed a separate Social Impact Assessment for FMU 14 dated 06/01/2020. Based on the SIA, there are 6 villages nearby the licensed area, Kg. Tataluan, Kg Bangau, Kg. Salarom Taka, Kg. Sandukan, Kg. Maatol, Kg. Mawantul, with an estimated population of 1027. The SIA study has outlined the potential impacts and mitigation measures.

#### **Scope of Assessment**

- The scope of the evaluation is to verify compliance of **Sapulut Forest Development Sdn. Bhd.** with the Sustainable Forest Management License Agreement (SFMLA 04/97) for FMU 14.
- The assessment is in accordance on the terms of the agreement for the "Sabah Legality Standard Principles 1 4 dated November 2020 (SFD-TLAS-002).
- Site evaluation to verify and report the level of compliance by **Sapulut Forest Development Sdn**. **Bhd.** and contractors to the standard in respect to each of the criteria within this report.
- Compliance is defined when the auditee demonstrates that the indicators consist of none or only minor gaps against any applicable criteria of the standard. Non-compliance to the Sabah Legality Standard occurs when the auditee does not demonstrate adequate compliance to a criterion.

#### Highlights of Assessment

(Major Gaps = 0; Minor Gaps = 2; Observations = 1)

Sapulut Forest Development Sdn. Bhd. has complied with the Sabah Legality Standard (SFD-TLAS-002) as no non-compliance was identified during the assessment on 03-07 July 2023.

Summary of status of operations by Principle:

#### Principle 1.

Sapulut Forest Development demonstrated compliance with the license requirements and submission of documents such as the EIA monitoring reports to the relevant authorities.

#### July 2022: Gap 001/2022 (minor) – Checklist 1.2.3

Lack of housekeeping and monitoring at the contractor worker's compound (Simgaya Campsite).

Lack of first aid kit at the contractor's workshop (Jaya Campsite).

Lack of fire extinguisher at the contractor's diesel depot and Genset shed house Jaya and Simgaya Campsite).

Lack of oil pan for used oil at the scheduled waste store (Jaya Campsite).

Lack of containment pan for used battery at the scheduled waste store (Jaya Campsite).

#### July 2023: Gap 001/2022 (minor) - Closed

Sapulut Forest Development has taken action to address housekeeping, oil/liquid battery spillage, first aid kit & fire extinguishers.

Sapulut Forest Development has a 10-year FMP from 01/01/2016 to 31/12/2025 (3<sup>rd</sup> revision), approved by the Chief Conservator of Forests on 17/03/2017. There is no separate PDP as the current FMP is considered equivalent to a PDP.

#### **Highlights of Assessment**

Licensed boundaries are identified on the ground, marked with signboards and yellow paint and visible. The Sapulut Forest Development Management Inventory identified most of the area as a very poor forest based on the SFD stratification system.

#### July 2023: Gap 001/2023 (minor) - Checklist 1.3.3

No evidence that revision of the 3<sup>rd</sup> FMP was submitted to SFD.

#### July 2023: Gap 002/2023 (minor) - Checklist 1.6.1

The total area for protection inside the CHPP/CPP document is not defined.

#### July 2022: Gap 002/2022 (minor) - Checklist 1.8.1

The company has not clearly quantified the areas under each stratum in relation to the planned establishment of Industrial Tree Plantations & NFM operations.

#### July 2023: Gap 002/2022 (minor) - Closed

Sapulut Forest Development has mapped and defined the total area under each stratum.

#### Principle 2.

Sapulut Forest Development demonstrated compliance with the Forest Operation principle. The NFM area is designated for RIL harvesting method whereas, ITP development area is still using the conventional logging method.

All protected areas are mapped and identified on the ground. There is no evidence that the Sapulut Forest Development has encroached the protection areas.

#### July 2023: Observation 001-2023 – Checklist 2.1.1

Excessive blading, which exceeded RIL specifications for road width at SR01 at compartment 148A.

#### July 2022: Observation 001-2022 – Checklist 2.1.3

The signboard for the culvert (CL33) is missing at Compartment 162B. An additional cross piece at Compartment 162B is not updated in the CHP map SR02.

#### July 2023: Observation 001-2022 (Addressed)

All signboard is maintained and the additional cross piece is updated on the CHP map for Compartment 162B.

#### July 2022: Observation 002-2022 – Checklist 2.3.3

According to the company, the Noise Risk Assessment and Ergonomic Assessment issues raised by DOSH are still in progress.

#### July 2023: Observation 002-2022 (Addressed)

Sapulut Forest Development has developed the Noise Risk Assessment and Ergonomic Assessment using a standard checklist form as recommended by DOSH.

#### Principle 3.

Sapulut Forest Development has paid logs royalty payment and the record was maintained.

#### July 2022: Observation 003-2022 – Checklist 3.1.1

The company submitted OP renewal applications and are pending feedback from SFD.

#### July 2023: Observation 003-2022 (Addressed)

All Occupation Permits are renewed and valid.

#### Principle 4.

A separate Social Impact Assessment (SIA) was developed in January 2020. Based on the SIA, there are 6 villages nearby the licensed area, Kg. Tataluan, Kg Bangau, Kg. Salarom Taka, Kg. Sandukan, Kg. Maatol, Kg. Mawantul, with an estimated population of 1027.

Sapulut Forest Development continues to communicate well and consults with the local communities. The company had a formal Standard Operating Procedure to address disputes and grievances from the community.

#### July 2022: Observation 004-2022 – Checklist 4.1.3

The total water catchment area for Kg. Tonomon is not adequately defined in the map. July 2023: Observation 004-2022 (Addressed)

Highlights of Assessment Sapulut Forest Development has defined the total area for the water catchment.

**Observation 001-2023 – Checklist 2.1.1:** Road construction shall be based on the RIL guidelines and the contractor monitored for compliance.

The next annual surveillance audit will be scheduled for July 2024.
