Non-compliance must be formally addressed prior to certification or within 2 months following a surveillance assessment.

JG Progressive Enterprise is a sole proprietor; thus, it does not require registering under the Companies Commission of Malaysia (SSM). JG Progressive Enterprise imports plywood from Indonesia, Vietnam and Sabah and purchases sawn timber from local suppliers and sells them to the local market.

The previous assessment was conducted in February 2023 that resulted in 4 gap(s) and 0 observation(s) (Report #: GFSSBH 004-469).

JG Progressive Enterprise did not engage any other subcontractors to provide or manufacture products. JG Progressive Enterprise engages R.M Service Sdn. Bhd. as its agent to handle documentation for import activities.
